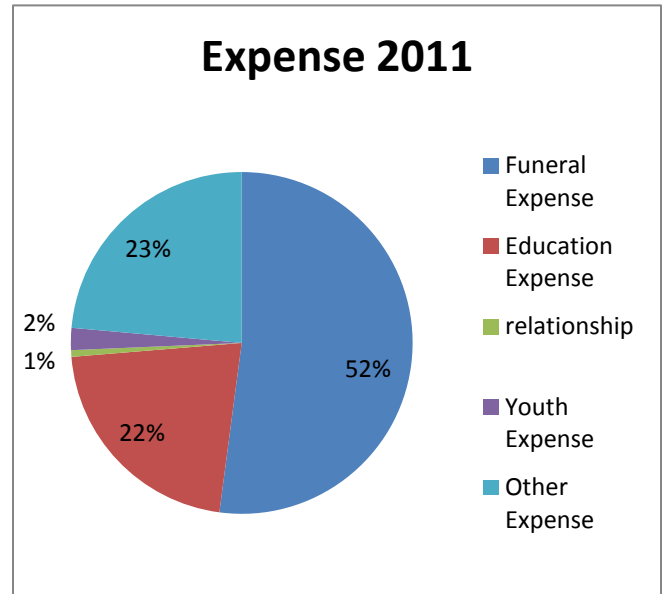

Total operating Expense: **\$48,786.70**

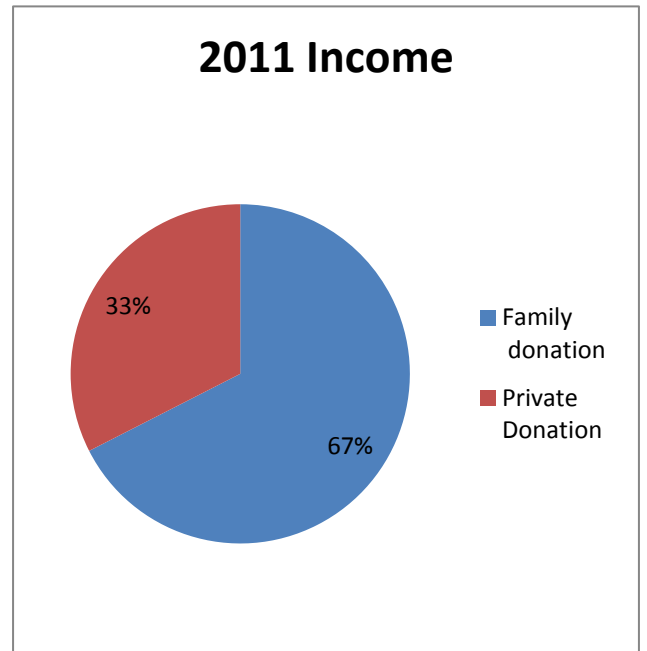


Sources of Dollars

Program and services

Funeral

Fiscal year 2011, UYFO received \$33,517.32 in donations from family members for funeral services of Wantaj Yang. This amount was not the total cost of the funeral.

Education

In 2011, UYFO provided our family members with a workshop on how to educate and prevent our children from marrying within our family “Yaj yuav Yaj”. UYFO received \$12,600 as donation from Southeast Asian Health Services, Inc. UYFO used this to fund for research, workshops, and programs and activities for our youths that are currently enrolled in school.

Youth and Relationship

In 2011, we spent \$1,020 in youth programs. This amount excludes the total amount of money that we spent in youth programs for the year. We spent \$305 on floral purchases for Wantaj Yang’s funeral service and Txoos Tuam Yang’s funeral service. This amount has been classified as a public relation expense.

Other

Other expenses incurred in 2011 are for the UYFO Summer Picnic, New Year Celebration, Wantaj Yang’s Thank You Dinner. We spent a total of \$11,508 in 2011 for the mentioned activities.

Commend

In 2011 UYFO has been progressive to reach the goals successfully; however we still lacks many necessary activities due to shorted of funds and volunteers. We hope that in 2012, we will be able to get more funds to create more programs and activities that could help more family members.
